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Homefield Energy to Mail Electric Aggregation Information Next Week

The electric supplier for Franklin’s electric aggregation program plans to mail information kits to eligible residents and small businesses on March 23 to explain the village’s new service agreement for its supply of electricity. The new agreement will begin with June meter readings.

The kit will include information about the new rate for electricity—4.584 cents per kilowatthour—and ways residents who wish not to participate may opt out at any time and at no cost. Information about terms and conditions, which will not change, will be included.

Homefield Energy, the village’s current supplier, won a 24-month contract in competitive bidding late last year. The new rate is approximately 27 percent less than the current rate of 6.285 cents per kilowatthour. It will be fixed through meter readings of June 2022.

Under the village’s electric supply program, implemented in June 2015, residents are not obligated to participate. They may opt out at no cost and at any time by calling Homefield’s customer care center toll free at 866-694-1262.

Enrollment is automatic as the new service agreement begins, which means that those who wish to join or remain with the village electric aggregation program need not do anything. No interruption in service is required. Individuals who move into or within the village may enroll, also by calling Homefield’s toll free number.

The village program includes all costs except taxes related to electric supply and transmission. Ameren will continue to provide distribution services in the community, and that cost is stated separately on the customer bill. Customers continue to receive only one bill from Ameren, which handles calls related to billing and service.
